Android Camera and Google Photos

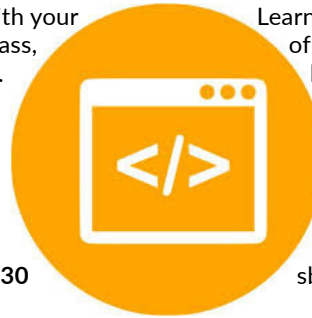
