### **Public Internet Use Policy**

The SBPL strives to be a gateway to the global network of recorded thought and information. We are committed to providing superior services to all segments of our diverse community, as well as employing state of the art technology to improve access to global resources. As a part of our mission to meet the educational and recreational needs of our public, the library makes available free access to the Internet.

The SBPL endorses the ALA Library Bill of Rights, the American Library Association's Freedom to Read statement and the NJ Library Association's People's Library Bill of Rights. Thus, all library users are provided equal access to resources available on the Internet.

The SBPL does not endorse the viewpoints or vouch for the accuracy or authenticity of information accessed via the Internet. It is left to each user to determine what information is appropriate. Library personnel do not monitor or supervise Internet access. Parents or guardians of minors using the Internet, not the library staff, are responsible for providing guidance to the children under their care. Parental supervision of children searching the Internet is advised.

Users have the right of confidentiality in all their activities with resources and services provided by the SBPL. The Library supports the user's right to privacy; however, users are advised that, because security is technically difficult to achieve, electronic communications and files can become public.

The SBPL reserves the right to terminate an Internet session at any time.
